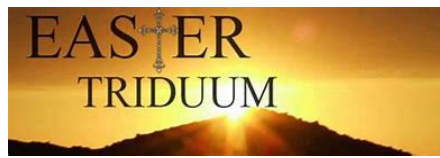
### Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten Registrations

## *The Paschal Triduum*

*Our Passion/Palm Sunday celebrations take us from Jesus' triumphant arrival in Jerusalem, where he is greeted with the waving of palm branches and shouts of "Hosanna!" through his final meal with his disciples, agony in the garden, arrest, trial, passion, suffering and death on the cross. We now begin Holy Week, the days leading up to the highlight of our liturgical year, the Paschal Triduum. Although the Triduum lasts for three days, from Holy Thursday evening until Easter Sunday evening, it is one continuous, unified celebration in which we are plunged into the Paschal Mystery, the core of our faith as Christians. In this spirit, please take some time to reflect on the Triduum celebrations in our parish community and their importance to each of us as disciples of Christ in the world!*

### *Holy Thursday: Mass of the Lord's Supper*

March 28, 7:00 p.m.

As our Holy Thursday celebration begins, you will note that the church has been transformed from the somber colours of Lent to a more welcoming banquet hall, inviting us to "Glory in the Cross of Christ!"

The holy oils for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick are brought forward in the entrance procession and presented to the parish community. These oils were blessed and consecrated by Archbishop Emeritus James Weisgerber for the parishes of the archdiocese at the Chrism Mass on March 18. As the *Glory to God* is sung to announce the end of the Lenten season, the oils are processed to their place of honour within the church.

The Gospel for this celebration is St. John's Last Supper account which recalls Jesus washing the feet of his disciples - a powerful sign of the call to serve one another. In the spirit of Jesus, Fr. Brian will wash the feet of a few parishioners.

After communion, the Eucharist is taken in procession to a place of reservation where it will remain for adoration and reflection until 9:00 p.m. The sanctuary and altar are stripped in preparation for Good Friday. *(Those wishing to leave after the procession of the Blessed Sacrament are asked to do so quietly to maintain the prayerful atmosphere.)*

### *Good Friday: Celebration of the Lord's Passion*

March 29, 1:00 and 3:00 p.m.

As we recall Christ's passion and death, the atmosphere of the church is stark and darkened when we gather for the afternoon services. Our celebration from Thursday night continues, so there is no opening hymn or greeting. The Suffering Servant from Isaiah and the reading from Hebrews prepare us for Jesus' loving response to the Father's call to suffering and death in the proclamation of the Passion from the gospel of John. The prayers of intercession offer our solemn concern for the world.

The central symbol of this gathering - the cross - is presented, inviting us to reflect on how this object of suffering and execution has become the symbol of triumph in our faith as Christians. A short communion service with hosts which were consecrated at the Holy Thursday celebration follows. All are asked to leave in silence so as not to break the prayerful quiet atmosphere within the church.

The church will remain open until 8:00 p.m. for anyone who would like to spend additional time in prayer and veneration before the cross.

## *Holy Saturday: The Easter Vigil- The Resurrection of the Lord*

March 30, 8:00 p.m.

The Easter Vigil is indeed the highlight of our liturgical year, our 'night of nights'! We begin with the lighting of the Easter fire from which the Paschal candle will be lit, the first symbol to announce Christ's resurrection. (*This will be outside, weather permitting. Please bring a jacket.*) We then process into the church led by the Light of Christ and pass this light on to all present and the *Exultet*, an ancient proclamation of joy and praise for our Risen Saviour, is chanted.

The Liturgy of the Word begins as three passages from the Hebrew Scriptures are proclaimed, foreshadowing the promise fulfilled through Christ, the Messiah. The joyful ringing of bells accompanies the *Glory to God*, and the epistle of St. Paul to the Romans and the Easter Gospel assure us that Christ is indeed risen! Alleluia! (*Don't forget to bring your bells for the 'Glory to God'!*)

The *Litany of the Saints* and the blessing of the Easter water begin our celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation. We have a family celebrating initiation this year, with the youngest child being baptized and her older sister and parents celebrating full initiation through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Prepare to share in the newly blessed Easter water during the sprinkling rite!

Our celebration continues with the Liturgy of the Eucharist, as our new members are welcomed to the Lord's Eucharistic table for the first time. We are then sent forth to share our joyful Easter *Alleluia* with the world!

There will be a reception in the hall after the celebration, in honour of the newly initiated members of our parish community!

## *Easter Sunday: Alleluia! Christ Is Risen!*

March 31, 9:00 and 11:00 a.m.

We continue to gather as a faith community to celebrate Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday morning. We will be renewing our baptismal promises at both Masses as we continue the Easter Vigil's call to the waters of new life. Let our great ALLELUIA ring out for the next 50 days as we joyfully journey through Easter to Pentecost with our Risen Lord!

Saint Patrick's Day was made an official Christian feast day in the early 17th century and is observed by the Catholic Church, the Anglican Community, the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Lutheran Church. The day commemorates Saint Patrick and the arrival of Christianity in Ireland, and, by extension, celebrates the heritage and culture of the Irish in general. Saint Patrick's Day is a public holiday in the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, the Canadian provinces of Newfoundland and Labrador, and the British Overseas Territory of Montserrat. It is also widely celebrated in the United Kingdom, Canada, Brazil, the United States, Argentina, Australia, South Africa, and New Zealand, especially amongst the Irish Diaspora. Saint Patrick's Day is celebrated in more countries than any other national festival. Modern celebrations have been greatly influenced by those of Irish descent, particularly those that developed in North America.

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.



*"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"*

Palm Sunday Mass begins in a separate location, usually a parish hall or outside (weather permitting). The Gospel is proclaimed, the palms are blessed, and we process to the Church for the remainder of the Mass, waving our palms and signing the refrain 'Hosanna, Hosanna, in the Highest'.

The Passion of Christ is often proclaimed by three persons who take on the roles of the Narrator, the people, and Jesus. The part of Jesus is proclaimed by the priest or deacon of the parish.

**Why we have Palms at Mass**  
In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.



> Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the following year's Ash Wednesday observance.

> The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

> The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

#### **Position Summary:**

Reporting to the Director of Pastoral Services, and working collaboratively with the Archbishop and Archdiocesan Administration, the Financial Officer is responsible for oversight of all financial operations of the Archdiocese and provides strategic financial guidance and effective advisory support to the Leadership Team of the Archdiocese of Regina. The Financial Officer ensures compliance with regulatory requirements and fosters long-term financial sustainability of the archdiocese. As part of the Leadership Team of the Archdiocese of Regina, the successful candidate will bring their energy and enthusiasm for the mission of the Church.

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Ensure financial goals and objectives, including long-term planning, are met and are in accordance with Canon Law, Archdiocesan policies and procedures, and current legislation.
- Prepare and monitor the annual operating budget with the Archdiocese Finance Council.
- Ensure preparation of monthly, quarterly and annual financial statements for distribution to appropriate leadership.
- Make financial recommendations to the Leadership Team of the Archdiocese of Regina and the Archdiocesan Finance Council.
- Establish, monitor, and enforce internal controls, policies and procedures for accounting, finances, administration, and payroll for all Archdiocesan entities.
- Oversee required Archdiocesan audit processes, accounting policies and procedures, and payroll systems.
- Oversee external Archdiocesan service contracts, risk management and insurance programs.
- Manage and monitor all investments collaboratively with the Investment Committee, including acquisition and disposal of real property, stocks, bonds and other financial instruments.
- Analyze financial information for construction and renovation projects presented to the Archbishop for approval.
- Oversee Archdiocesan property management.
- Engage effectively with the other members of the Leadership Team to foster collaboration and alignment of the financial department and resources with the mission, vision and strategic goals of the Archdiocese.
- Assign tasks, monitor the work flow of the finance department, and provide coaching and feedback as required.

**Qualifications:**

- Certified Professional Accountant (CPA) designation required.
- 3+ years in a senior accounting position with supervisory responsibilities.
- Superior knowledge of Canada Revenue Agency guidelines, accounting and payroll principles, and practices.
- Experience with preparing registered charity annual returns would be an asset.
- Proficient user of accounting software (Sage 50) and MS Office software, expressly Excel.
- Proven leadership ability and vision with a commitment to the mission of the Catholic Church.
- Volunteer or professional experience with religious organizations or contexts.
- Advanced analytical, negotiating and problem-solving skills.
