Most recently, he participated as a table facilitator at the 2nd Synodal Assembly in Rome in October. 

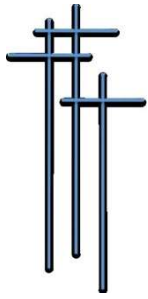
